Election of Officers

The members of the East Jersey Trout Unlimited's Board of Directors are volunteers who are responsible for managing the affairs and activities of the chapter. To do this each member of the board is generally responsible for taking care of one facet of the chapter's various tasks.

The members of the Board of Directors meet for two to three hours during the evening of the last Thursday of each month throughout the year. At the meetings the members review the Chapter's finances and membership, discuss projects that are underway and propose new projects and activities. When matters such as expenditures of the Chapter's funds are proposed, decisions are reached through majority vote of the board members; other topics are often addressed by advising responsible members how to proceed after open discussions.

Definitions

Anadromous – An anadromous fish, born in fresh water, spends most of its life in the sea and returns to fresh water to spawn. Steelhead, salmon, smelt, shad, striped bass, and sturgeon are examples.

Catadromous - A catadromous fish does the opposite lives in fresh water and enters salt water to spawn. Most of the eels are catadromous.

Phragmites – A reed or large perennial grass found in wetlands throughout temperate and tropical regions of the world; the plants that cover the Meadowlands.
