

Egg Drop

Trout in the Classroom (TIC) begins in the fall of the year when trout eggs are delivered to participating schools and continues until the following spring when fingerlings are released into local streams.

New Jersey's Trout Unlimited Chapters assist schools in their vicinities by delivering the eggs that the Pequest Trout Hatchery produces and then



by providing any support needed by the participating schools. Here in northeastern New Jersey EJTU has eighteen participating schools in its area of responsibility and we will soon be delivering fertilized trout eggs to them.

On the day that we deliver the eggs to the schools, our EJTU volunteers assemble in the parking lot of the Willowbrook Mall

while, George Petersen, the TIC coordinator goes to the hatchery to pick up the eggs. When George returns from the hatchery he gives the eggs and trout food to the volunteers who will deliver them. The volunteers, usually

two to a vehicle, then proceed to the schools, deliver the eggs and go home. In most cases the process is over by noon.

This is an en-

joyable project because the children in the schools look forward to getting the eggs. Moreover, it takes only a few hours and is carried out in our locality.

This year we will deliver to eighteen schools on Wednesday, October 26. If you can spare a few hours to volunteer for this activity please contact George Petersen at grpetersen44@verizon.net

Tom Gilmore will present his Big Apple Sampler the author's favorite Tri-state Trout Streams at our November 9 meeting. This is a trout stream tour of the tri-states top trout streams from his January 2011 book "Flyfishers Guide to the Big Apple."

We will take an in-depth look at, New Jersey's Flatbrook, Pequest, Musconetcong, Pequannock, and South Branch of the Raritan River. Then tour the Catskill's "Charmed Circle" which includes the Beaverkill, Willowemoc, Neversink., Esopus and the Schoharie as well as the lesser know wild trout gems, the Roundout, Rochester, Callicoon and Katterskill.

Next we will move west to the "world class" Upper Delaware River System, the West Branch, East Branch and Mainstem of the Delaware.

Then we are off to Pennsylvania's Pocono and "Endless" Mountains, to fish the Brodhead, Big Bushkill, Pocono, McMichaels, Bowmans and Fishing Creek.
